The Asian American Studies Program is hiring a lecturer for Asian Am 102: Introduction to Comparative Ethnic Studies which will be offered Monday, Wednesdays, and Fridays, 11:00-11:50 in 114 Van Hise.

This course introduces students to a multicultural history of the United States, focusing on each of the major ethnic groups: European Americans, African Americans, Native Americans, Chicano/as, Latino/as and Asian Americans.

**To ensure consideration:** Review of applications will begin on November 14, 2011 and continue until the position is filled.

**Master's degree required.**

Responsible for teaching Asian Am 102: Intro to Comparative Ethnic Studies course (3 credits) Spring semester 2012.

This course is cross-listed with Chican@ Latin@ Studies (CLS 102) and Folklore.

Duties include teaching this course; preparing course materials; presenting lectures and facilitating classroom discussions; preparing, administering and grading papers and exams; and holding office hours. Class size will be approximately 60 students.

This is a 33% appointment for the Spring 2012 semester, beginning on January 13, 2012 and ending on May 27, 2012.

**Minimum \$34,202 ACADEMIC (9 months) Depending on Qualifications (At the lowest rate, the salary is \$5,643 for the one course (33% of the full time academic rate of \$34,202)).**
